Religion follows a course sequence for each grade level. Religion qualifies as an elective credit for graduation. A student may only be exempt from religion if there is a scheduling conflict.

Additional Considerations

- Online courses will not be approved during the school year if the course is being offered on campus.
- Students that take additional courses outside of the standard course sequence may have additional courses scheduled in order to meet a full class schedule freshman-junior year.
- Students may take a reduced course load their senior year if they have met all previous graduation requirements.
- Dual enrollment courses are self-paid by the family. Scholarship funds will not be used to pay for dual enrollment or online courses not offered as a part of the standard course sequence.
- Summer school courses are offered for credit recovery. These courses are self-paid for the summer term.
- HCA does not participate in early graduation (18 requirements) but students may graduate early with the full 24 requirements.
- Scholarship students must take 4 or more classes on campus their senior year.
